

How to access past exam papers and mark schemes

One of the most important ways of preparing for the GCSE exams is to practice past exam questions. This will allow you to practice the exam skills you need and cause you to go over the different topics and fill in any gaps in your knowledge.

You can practice writing highly detailed answers and you can practice timed answers. You should be aiming to complete each answer in roughly the same number of minutes as there are marks available. So, a 2 mark question should take no more than 2 minutes; a six mark question should take about 8 minutes.

If you practice a large number of exam questions, when you walk into the exam hall, it is much less likely that you will face a question that you can't answer.
